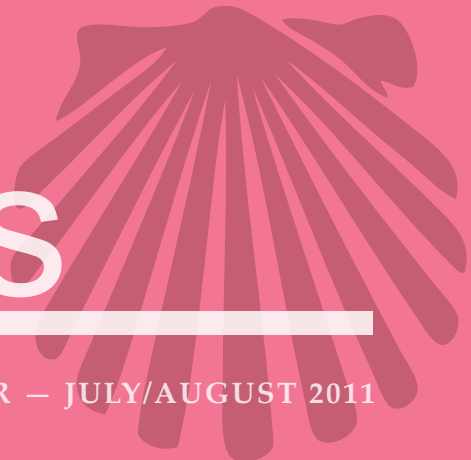

## Lost Ladybug Project

Quail Hill Farm, Deep Lane, Amagansett

Whether you've seen them in your window sill, garden, or as a stuffed animal, ladybugs are one of the best known insects. Although cute, they are actually ferocious predators of plant pests like aphids and mealy bugs. Recently, changes in the population of this beneficial insect have prompted Cornell University to initiate the Lost Ladybug Project. Learn more when you meet Peter Priolo, Agricultural Stewardship Educator for Cornell Cooperative Extension. We'll gently capture, identify and release ladybugs at the farm—all data collected will be sent to Cornell University for research. Bring sunscreen, an old white pillow case to make your net, and a digital camera if you have one.
