Using watercolor gouache, you will learn how to capture light and shadow, color, atmosphere, and distance as well as tricks for painting textures, shapes of flowers and trees, and all things gardens. Who Lives Under the Sea?

At the Waterfront, End of New Suffolk Avenue, New Suffolk

Bring your children to the beach for a fun exploration with the Trust and the educators from the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation. Hosted by the New Suffolk Waterfront, your children will learn fun facts about creatures living in our local bays and then get up close to a variety of marine animals brought to the beach with a seine net. All sea creatures will be released safely back into the sea. Bring a water bottle.

All attendees must wear water shoes to protect feet and be prepared to get wet. FREE! All ages welcome, space is limited, reservations required. Rain cancels.

Natural History of Broad Cove, a Nature Paddle

Launch end of Indian Point Road, Riverhead

Bring your own kayak for a guided paddle of the waters off Broad Cove, a pristine 100-acre woodland on Flanders Bay. This paddle tour will focus on the natural history and story of this property, one of the largest former duck farms from the early 1900s. Led by local birders Nancy Gilbert and Richard Wines, explore the western shoreline up through Terry's Creek as well as the areas once inhabited by ducks. Conserved in 2021 by the Peconic Land Trust, this fragile Peconic Estuary ecosystem offers much to enjoy, including soon-to-be available woodland trails.

\$20/person. Space is limited, reservations are required. Bring your own kayak or canoe, water bottle, and bag lunch for social hour following paddle. PFDs with water safety whistle are required to launch. Rain date is July 27.

Salt Air Farm Walking Tour of Dike System

1535 New Suffolk Road, Cutchogue

Long Island's East End farms operate within a unique micro-climate that balances soil and water. Join us at Salt Air Farm in Cutchogue to walk the longest dike system on our beautiful East End, created in the 1940s. Along the way, learn from farmers Dan and Prudence Heston how this unique system works, why it is important to their farm, and the challenges (and joys) of farming in a seaside environment. Dress appropriately for a 2.5-mile hike.

Meet and Greet with Birds of Prey!

If you've always wanted to see a bird of prey up close, this is your chance. These permanently injured animals now live at the Refuge, are ambassadors of wildlife education, and include beautiful owls and falcons.

Exploring the Waters of Shinnecock Bay

South Side of Ponquogue Bridge, Dune Road, Hampton Bays

Bring your children to the Town Park, located just over the Ponquogue Bridge, and explore life under the sea! Meet the educators from the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation for a presentation on marine life, and then help capture undersea creatures using a seine net. Learn more about the influence of the Shinnecock Inlet on the inhabitants of Shinnecock Bay, as you examine an amazing variety of crabs, small fish, mollusks, and even shrimp. Last year we met a seahorse! All sea creatures will be released safely back into the sea. Bring a water bottle.

All attendees must wear water shoes to protect feet and be prepared to get wet.

Recognizable by its intense blue color, cyanotype is an early photographic process that uses sunlight exposure to capture shadows and translucent imagery beautifully. Experience this magical artistic process! Pre-treated fabric and materials will be provided, you will create two 12”x12” fabric squares. Bring your favorite botanicals and plants and create your own original work of art.

Andrea will be presenting a site-specific installation at Bridge Gardens in September as the featured artist of Parrish Art Museum’s 2024 Road Show.



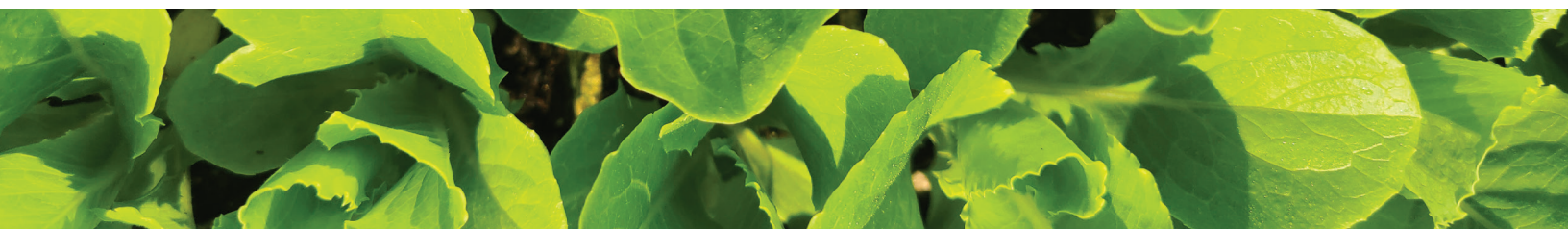
