– a Bark Identification Walk

And the branching structure in the dormant months can tell the tree's story. Join us for an in-person, outdoor walk with local arborist Tom Volk of Summerhill Landscapes to learn about the many different trees growing throughout the garden and hone your skills!

Broad Cove Preserve, Overlook Drive, Riverhead
Join us to visit this 100+ acre preserve in search
of the famous Timberdoodle (the American
Woodcock) during its annual Spring mating
season. Led by naturalist John Turner, you'll learn
to listen for the distinctive mating sounds used
by male woodcocks to attract a mate. You'll also
learn to identify other birds that are active in the
evening and listen for Eastern Screech Owls who
may be nesting on the property. Bring binoculars,
flashlight, tick protection, and dress for
the weather.

Quail Hill Farm, Deep Lane, Amagansett

Extra hands are needed for our annual seeding workshop! Please help the farm get a head start on this year's eggplants and many beautiful varieties of peppers. You'll work side by side with Farm Director Layton Guenther and Farm Manager Madi Aldrich to plant these seeds in the trays destined for the greenhouse. In addition, learn about the importance of making and using compost. All participants are invited to return on **May 18** to transplant the seedlings into the fields of the farm.


